#### **READY FOR LISTENING AND LEARNING:**

- Be **punctual** to all online lessons, **log onto Teams before the start time**.

- Make sure you have a pen and paper to **take notes**.

#### **RESPECTFUL OF ALL:**

- Only **un-mute your microphone** if directed to do so by your teacher.
- Use the **'Hand up'** icon if you want to ask something and unmute when told.
- Use of the **chat room during the lesson is not allowed** – all comments are logged and this will be monitored.
- Lessons are recorded and will be available for viewing within your class team after the lesson has ended.
- Do **not take screen shots or pictures or make any recordings of any kind** during online lessons.

#### **RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR BEHAVIOUR:**

- **Listen carefully** during lessons, **do not interrupt** staff or other students when they are talking.
- Make sure that your behaviour does **not prevent others from learning**.
- **Inappropriate, disruptive behaviour will not be tolerated.** All disruption will be reported and dealt with.

# Safety warning if you are doing a practical!



**Please be careful if you are making anything and check with your parent before you cut or use anything**

**1. You work at an appropriate table/ surface**

**2. You cover the table/ surface with newspaper or an old sheet**

**3. Ask permission from your parent before you touch/ use anything**

**4. Ensure the items you are use are clean- wash them with soapy water if necessary**

**5. Take care if there are sharp edges- sand down or wear protective gloves**

**6. Ask your parent to teach you how to use the tools correctly**

**7. You need to be supervised when doing practical work**

**10. When you are finishing your work – ensure your environment is well ventilated**

**9. Check with your parent about the best way to assemble your work**

**8. Wear eye protection and a mask if the work creates any dust**
