

Our History Curriculum is...

GCSE AQA History comprises of four units:



- Health and the People, c.1000 present day
- Elizabethan England including a study of a historic environment 1568-1603
- Democracy and Dictatorship in Germany, 1890-1945
- Conflict and Tension between East and West, 1945-1972







There are two examined courses:

- Tsarist and Communist Russia, 1855-1964
- The Making of Modern Britain, 1951-2007

Additionally, there is a compulsory coursework element:
